Other Chemical Test Kit Precautions

- Keep all chemicals, chemical kits and chemical waste out of reach of children!
- Always wear gloves and safety glasses when performing the D.O., Nitrate, Ammonia or Phosphate tests.

Other Chemical Test Kit Precautions

- Be aware of the wind direction.
- Containerize nitrate waste in a heavy-walled plastic container such as the cubitainers provided by the VWQM Program.
- Label the container with the waste from the tests performed. Do NOT combine other chemical wastes (e.g., old motor oil) with VWQM chemical wastes.

Always Wear Foot Protection

In order to prevent cuts from hooks, glass, metal, tab tops, etc., never go into a stream without foot protection that covers your entire foot, such as tennis shoes or boots. Sandals of any kind are not recommended.



Wading Considerations

- If the stream is deep, wear a life jacket. If the stream is flooded, do not attempt to wade into the stream or conduct monitoring.
- Never leave children unsupervised.



Pathogenic Bacteria and Parasites

- Avoid contact between river water and your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Avoid contact between the water and any breaks in your skin; e.g., cuts, scrapes, etc.
- Check with your family physician or county health department to discuss appropriate immunization.

The Law

- 2nd Degree Trespass – You are unaware you trespassed
- Penalty: No jail but \$200 maximum



The Law

- 1st Degree Trespass – you are aware you trespassed
- Penalty: Jail or \$500 maximum

- Tanks with altered fittings
- Bags of table or rock salt
- Blister cold pill packets



Meth Waste

Things to recognize as possible Meth Waste items:

- Bent spoons
- Funnels
- Weighing scales
- Hot plate
- Needles
- Rubber gloves
- Coffee filters, plastic containers, dishware, or anything with a white chalky residue
